



## CRITICAL PATH INSTITUTE LAUNCHES NEW ITUNES APP

Created to facilitate patient participation in accurately tracking and communicating medication use

**Tucson, Arizona, September 21, 2011** – Critical Path Institute (C-Path), in cooperation with app co-developer, Scientific Technologies Corporation (STC), has just launched **MyMedsList**, which is available on iTunes for iPhone, iPad, and iPod Touch.

The application was created to encourage patients to keep better track of the medications they are taking, including prescription drugs, over-the-counter (OTC) products, dietary supplements, and vitamins, and builds on the capabilities provided by C-Path's [www.mymedslist.org](http://www.mymedslist.org) website.

Users can create an electronic record of the medications they, or their family members, take, along with the prescriber and pharmacy information associated with those medications. This record can then be printed or emailed to share with doctors, pharmacists, and other healthcare providers, who can then more effectively prevent adverse reactions and interactions between the medicines, foods, or supplements being taken by those patients. To maintain privacy, the information is fully controlled by the user and is only recorded on the user's electronic device.

"C-Path is committed to improving the development of new medications, as well as promoting safe medication use. We believe that the MyMedsList app is a great tool to help patients and their healthcare providers work as a team to monitor medications being taken, increasing the likelihood of medication benefit," said Raymond Woosley, MD, PhD, President and CEO of C-Path.

To purchase, go to Apple's iTunes Store and search MyMedsList. The app costs \$.99 to download. The revenues will be used to develop additional features for this app and develop other apps to promote safe medication use.
